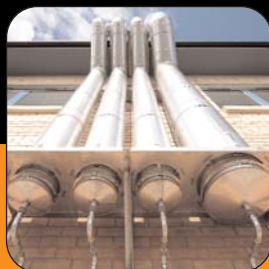
The Mechanical Services installation comprised:

- Natural Gas fired LTHW boiler plant, with LPG tank farm and supply for stand-by, serving radiators and coils within air handling units and domestic water calorifiers
- Air handling units providing supply and extract ventilation for the ward areas and separate plant for the operating theatre suite
- Kitchen ventilation
- Medical gases installation
- Full BMS to provide integrated control of the mechanical services
